Joseph Cuseo—*Promoting Student Learning & Success During the First Year of College: Foundational, Research-Based Principles*

This presentation will focus on the instructional implications of a learning- and learner-centered paradigm for library science professionals, particularly with respect to seven key, learning principles.

Dr. Cuseo holds a doctoral degree in Educational Psychology and Assessment from the University of Iowa. Currently, he is a Professor of Psychology at Marymount College and director of the first-year seminar.

Korey Brunetti, Amy R. Hofer, & Lori Townsend—*Threshold Concepts: High-Impact IL Instruction*

This workshop will introduce attendees to threshold concepts, an emerging pedagogical strategy with strong potential for FYE course redesign. Three teaching librarians will describe their application of threshold concepts in a required first-year information literacy course.

Korey Brunetti is a Reference and Instruction Librarian and Collections Coordinator (mainly digital collections) at CSU East Bay. Amy R. Hofer is Research Instruction Librarian at Golden Gate University. Lori Townsend is a Reference, Instruction, and Electronic Collections Librarian at CSU East Bay.

Rhonda Rios Kravitz—*Library Instruction Plus: Developing a sense of belonging for students of color during the first-year experience*

Students of color have made great strides in terms of gaining access to colleges and universities. However, degree attainment remains low. Librarians have an important role to play in impacting the sense of belonging for students of color. This presentation will examine strategies and social support systems that enhance retention and persistence.

Dr. Rhonda Rios Kravitz was appointed the Dean of the Learning Resources Center at Sacramento City College in July 2007. From 1990 to 2007 she served as the Head of Access Services at the Sacramento State University Library.
