- 2. **D2L Discussion Board**-We will have several discussion topics, some are general questions for all to participate in and some very specific. Post a question or respond to one of the discussion topics. Everyone is welcome to join-in. If you see a question that you can help with...l encourage you to "go for it"!
- 3. **Chat**-I will post hours when I will be online to chat in real-time. This is generally before a major assignment due date but I hope to have a set times each week to be available.
- 4. **Call Me**-If it's urgent you are welcome to give me a call at the number listed in D2L "About Your Instructor". I do not have an office on-campus for face to face meetings, but if the need arises ,we can make arrangements.
