11. Summarize risk factors, prevention, detection, and treatment methods for prostate and testicular cancer.
12. Describe the risk factors, diagnosis, and treatment of penile and breast cancer in men.
13. Identify the risk factors, diagnosis, and treatment of anal cancer in men and women.
14. Describe the causes, treatments, and effects of toxic shock syndrome, vulvodynia, endometriosis, and prostatitis.
